FULL LINEUP ANNOUNCED FOR THE 30TH PEARL ANNIVERSARY OF THE SEATTLE JEWISH FILM FESTIVAL, MARCH 22-APRIL 6

MIDAS MAN, the electrifying story of Beatles manager Brian Epstein, to kick off the anniversary festival with a '60s dance party and dessert celebration

Local Heroes Spotlight, CARLA THE RESCUER, features a 101-year-old Spokane-based Dutch resistance fighter, with special guests from the film

Award-winning dark comedy BAD SHABBOS brings the festival to a hilarious close, followed by a special Havdalah champagne toast with director Daniel Robbins

SEATTLE, Wash. (February 26, 2025) – The Stroum Jewish Community Center proudly announces the full lineup of films, events, and guests for the **Seattle Jewish Film Festival's 30**th **Pearl Anniversary** from **March 22–April 6**. Featuring 30 films to mark SJFF's 30 years, this milestone festival includes 12 days of in-person screenings and events at five venues across the greater Seattle area, plus an encore in Walla Walla and two weeks of streaming access through April 13 for virtual films. The program is highlighted by special events featuring food, music, and guests. **Tickets, passes and packages are on sale now at SeattleJFF.org.**

"A pearl symbolizes not only the 30th anniversary but also rare beauty and precious wisdom formed under pressure and often challenging conditions," says Pamela Lavitt, Director of SJCC Arts + Ideas and Festivals. "The 30-year legacy of the Seattle Jewish Film Festival is a strand of 1,000 cinematic gems, each film carrying cherished stories of transformation from adversity to radiant strength. Over three decades, SJFF has grown into something brilliant and enduring: a source of Jewish community strength, pride, identity, thought leadership, and engagement for everyone."

As the Pacific Northwest's **largest and longest-running Jewish event**, SJFF attracts thousands of theater-goers across the Puget Sound area to experience Jewish cinema, history, and culture. Showcasing an inspiring shorts program and 22 feature-length films from 12 countries, the 30th-anniversary program strings together 30 cinematic gems: from lighthearted comedies and award-winning animation to powerful documentaries and gripping Israeli cinema.

"More than a film festival, SJFF is a community gathering place—fostering conversation, connection, and understanding across backgrounds," says Lavitt. "It serves as a vibrant cultural cornerstone in the region, deepening Jewish connections for all."

OPENING, BRUNCH + CLOSING HIGHLIGHTS

The festival **opens at AMC Pacific Place with MIDAS MAN**, a riveting drama chronicling the rise and fall of **Brian Epstein**, **the visionary manager behind The Beatles**. After the screening, audiences are invited to dance at a '60s-themed **DJ and dessert party** with a cash AMC bar. This film is part of the Music Maven Series.

A festival-favorite event, our Jewish comfort food **Sunday Brunch + Film features WELCOME TO YIDDISHLAND: A PLACE WITH NO BORDERS**, a documentary celebrating the revival of Yiddish culture through music, theater, and literature. Attendees will enjoy homemade Jewish comfort food and live Klezmer music by The KlezKatz! This film is also part of our Music Mavens Series.

The Closing Night Film, BAD SHABBOS, which premiered at Tribeca Film Festival, is an audience-award-winning, one-night-in-New York dark comedy starring Kyra Sedgwick and an incredible ensemble cast about a Shabbat dinner gone hilariously wrong. The screening is followed by a special champagne toast and filmmaker cheesecake reception with director Daniel Robbins. The festival wraps up with the Mishpokhe Matinee, a sing-along screening of FIDDLER ON THE ROOF with costume prizes, blintzes and borscht noshes, and trivia fun.

SERIES HIGHLIGHTS

This year's festival features **carefully curated film series** that explore identity, resilience, and Jewish heritage.

- Israeli Spotlight showcases RUNNING ON SAND, a comedy-drama about a refugee
 mistaken for a soccer star; THE STRONGHOLD, an intense Yom Kippur War drama
 starring Michael Aloni (Shtisel); and TORN, an in-depth look at the controversy
 surrounding the "Kidnapped from Israel" poster campaign.
- **Gay Gezunt! LGBTQ+ Spotlight** presents PINK LADY, a drama about a woman in an ultra-Orthodox Jewish community whose world begins to crumble when she discovers her husband's secret affair with his male study partner, and SABBATH QUEEN, a decadesspanning documentary about a rabbi-turned-drag queen.
- **Sephardic Spotlight** features THE BLOND BOY FROM CASBAH, a nostalgic journey through a filmmaker's Jewish childhood in Algeria, followed by a Sephardic coffee chat with biscochos cookies.
- Music Mavens strikes a chord with films like THE CITY, a hip-hop opera blending crime
 fiction and Israeli rap; JANIS IAN: BREAKING SILENCE, a documentary on the legendary
 singer-songwriter's fight for justice; and WELCOME TO YIDDISHLAND, celebrating the
 revival of Yiddish culture. The series opens with MIDAS MAN and closes with the
 beloved FIDDLER ON THE ROOF sing-along.
- Pearls of Wisdom presents ART SPIEGELMAN: DISASTER IS MY MUSE, an intimate look at the Pulitzer Prize-winning "Maus" creator; DEATH OF ZYGIELBOJM, a gripping political drama; and SHARI & LAMB CHOP, a nostalgic tribute to the beloved Jewish ventriloquist.
- Local Heroes honors courageous stories, including CARLA THE RESCUER, about a 101year-old Dutch resistance fighter from Spokane, and NEVER ALONE, following a Finnish-Jewish businessman who risked everything for refugees in WWII.

SPECIAL GUESTS + PREMIERES

SJFF's **30th anniversary lineup** includes **five West Coast premieres**, **five Washington state premieres**, **and ten Northwest premieres**. Festival screenings include **live Q&As, music, food, and prizes**. Featured guests include **directors Daniel Robbins (BAD SHABBOS), Lisa D'Apolito (SHARI & LAMB CHOP), Nim Shapira (TORN), and Larry Weinstein (BEETHOVEN'S NINE)**, along with the director and subjects of CARLA THE RESCUER: director Clement Lye, producer Kristine F. Hoover, and Paul V. Regelbrugge of Holocaust Center for Humanity with film subject Carla Peperzak joining via Zoom from Spokane. More guests are to be announced; check the SJFF website for updates and announcements.

VENUES + VIRTUAL SCREENINGS

Opening Weekend kicks off at AMC Pacific Place, with additional screenings at SIFF Cinema Uptown, Majestic Bay Theatres, and the SJCC. The resilience-themed shorts program, curated by Warren Etheredge, will screen at Gesa Power House Theater in Walla Walla and Hillel at the University of Washington (free for UW students and students of all ages). From March 31 to April 13, select films will be available for virtual streaming.

All are connected by the need to push on, fueled by an unanticipated renewal of belief.
