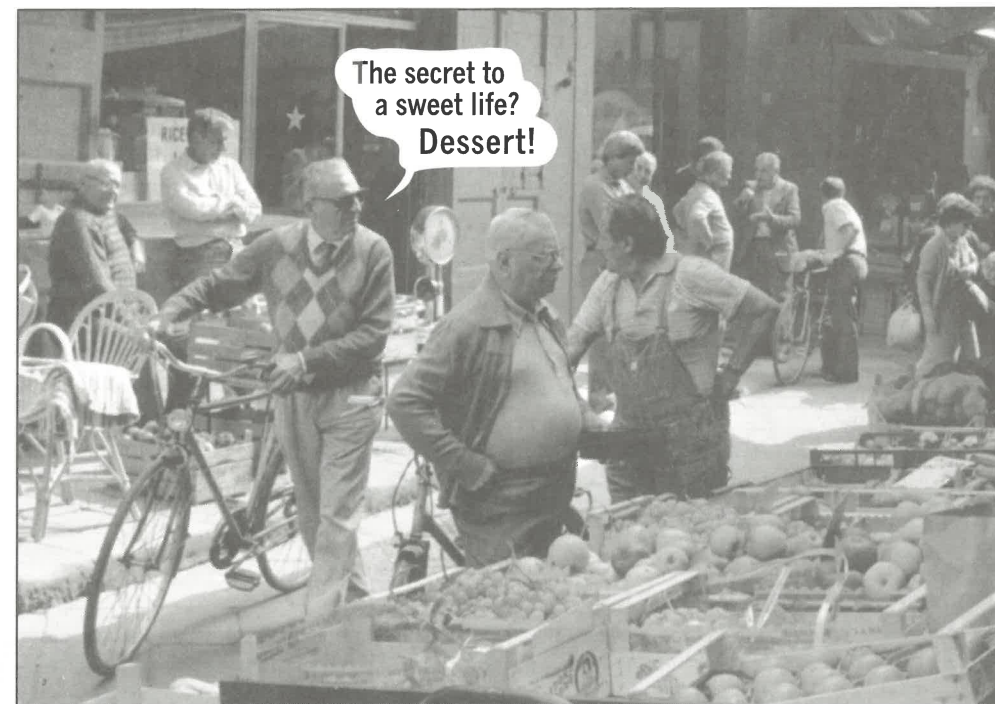

Dear Friends,

The Seattle Chapter of the American Jewish Committee is delighted to present the Ninth Annual Seattle Jewish Film Festival. Last year I overheard a few remarks in the Cinerama lobby that I think demonstrate how special our festival is. On opening night, one woman exclaimed, "This is better than Rosh Hashanah!" A regular attendee noted, "This is my one-week crash course in Jewish studies!" And a non-Jewish friend who enjoys the festival told me, "Thank you! This is such a gift!"

We hope that you will enjoy, learn from, and grapple with this year's films. The selection includes several Israeli films, as well as films which address Jewish themes in France, Sweden, German, Australia, Norway, Canada, and the U.S. Many of our films include post-screening discussions, allowing the audience to address controversial or difficult topics.

Like past festivals, SJFF 2004 includes a free matinee for seniors, free tickets for those in our community who otherwise could not attend, and of course, FILMTalks! During the festival week, FILMTalks! brings together 400 Seattle-area high school students for an all-day prejudice reduction workshop. AJC now also runs a FILMTalks!-based program in six Seattle-area high schools.

Our AJC chapter is thriving. In the past year, we started new dialogue groups with the Turkish-American community and with the Indian-American community. In November, AJC and the Turkish community in Seattle organized a memorial program for the victims of the three bombings in Istanbul. Also in November, we honored Norm and Constance Rice with AJC's prestigious Human Relations Award. In February, we presented a program addressing the difficult issues raised by Mel Gibson's film "The Passion." This May, Judea Pearl, President of the Daniel Pearl Foundation, will be the speaker at our annual Max Block Awards, which honor the human relations efforts of area high school students.

Seattle AJC is a chapter of the national American Jewish Committee, which does amazing things. Check out its superb web site, www.ajc.org. If you are not yet a member of AJC please consider joining. AJC is able to build local, national, and international programs through support from membership and tax-deductible donations.

A sincere thank you to the staff who have worked tirelessly to bring this festival to you: Daniel Mayer, Gregg Lachow, Sarah Rinzler, Scott Michelson, Tara Vodopich, Rabbi Rick Harkavy, and Marie Gunn. Also, thank you to our dedicated co-chairs, Moshe Dunie, Pip Meyerson, Leslie Rosen, and Janet Rosenblatt. Last, thank you, our audience, volunteers and supporters for your enthusiasm and participation over the past nine years. Enjoy!

The story of Ilan Ramon—child of a Holocaust survivor, heroic Air Force pilot, Israel's first astronaut, and ambassador of good will—is a profile in courage. If space is the final frontier, then those who explore it are our advance scouts, not for one tribe but for all humanity. Ilan and six others lost their lives when the space shuttle Challenger disintegrated 16 minutes before it was scheduled to land. 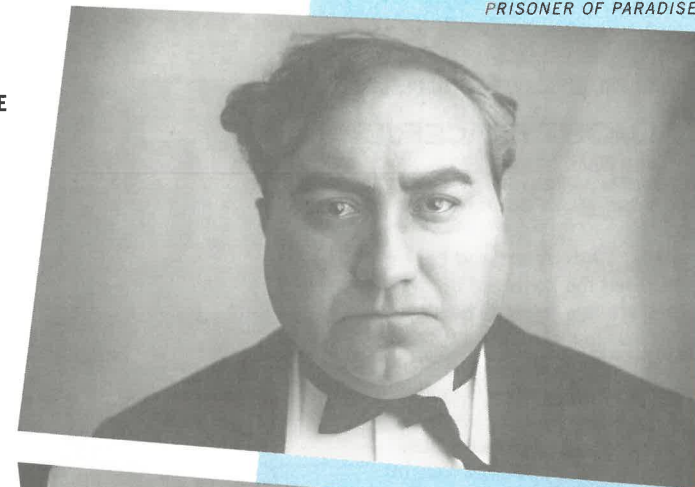

The stunning story of Kurt Geron, a highly successful German-Jewish actor (he sang "Mack the Knife" in the original *Threepenny Opera* and co-starred with Marlene Dietrich in *The Blue Angel*), director and cabaret star who was sent to Theresienstadt, where he was ordered to direct a pro-Nazi propaganda film. Hesitant at first, Geron ultimately threw himself into his work, laboring diligently to create a tiny jewel out of his appalling circumstances, all while knowing the terrible realities of life inside the camp.
